THE AUSTRALIAN LANDSCAPE PRINCIPLES

VALUE OUR LANDSCAPE: Projects should demonstrate innovative approaches to broader-scale landscape planning and pre-design strategies (e.g. landscape assessment and site selection strategies, collaborative/cross-sector planning initiatives, community participation/consultation, research programs etc.)

PROTECT › ENHANCE › REGENERATE: Projects should demonstrate innovative landscape design and management processes, aimed at measurable, sustainable outcomes (e.g. creative project implementation and design development initiatives – innovative design, construction and evaluation techniques, procurement and delivery methods, cross-sector partnership arrangements, education and research etc.)

DESIGN WITH RESPECT: Projects should demonstrate innovative approaches to current socio-cultural, environmental and economic aspects of landscape (e.g. emerging economic, social, political and demographic trends, resource supply and distribution issues, biodiversity loss, impacts of climate change etc.)

DESIGN FOR THE FUTURE: Projects should demonstrate creative approaches to building resilience in terms of enhancing socio-cultural, environmental and economic outcomes for future generations. (e.g. planning and resource distribution strategies, governance issues, community capacity building, education and research etc.)

EMBRACE RESPONSIVE DESIGN: Projects should demonstrate innovative, adaptable and responsive design processes, incorporate evaluative frameworks, and enhance potential to adjust to socio-cultural, environmental and economic change (e.g. integrated evaluation strategies, survey, monitoring and research programs, education/training and innovation initiatives).

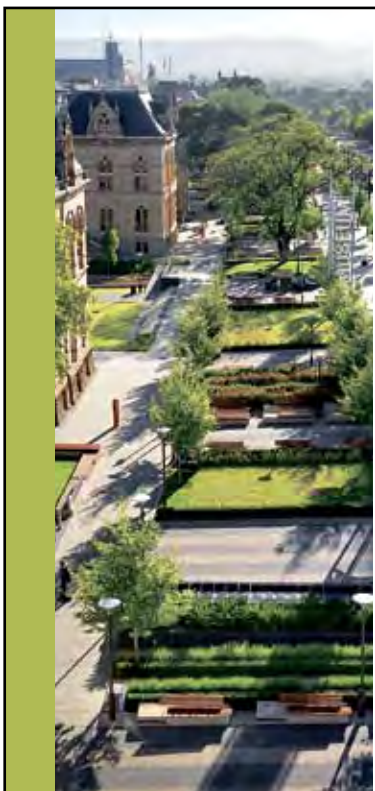

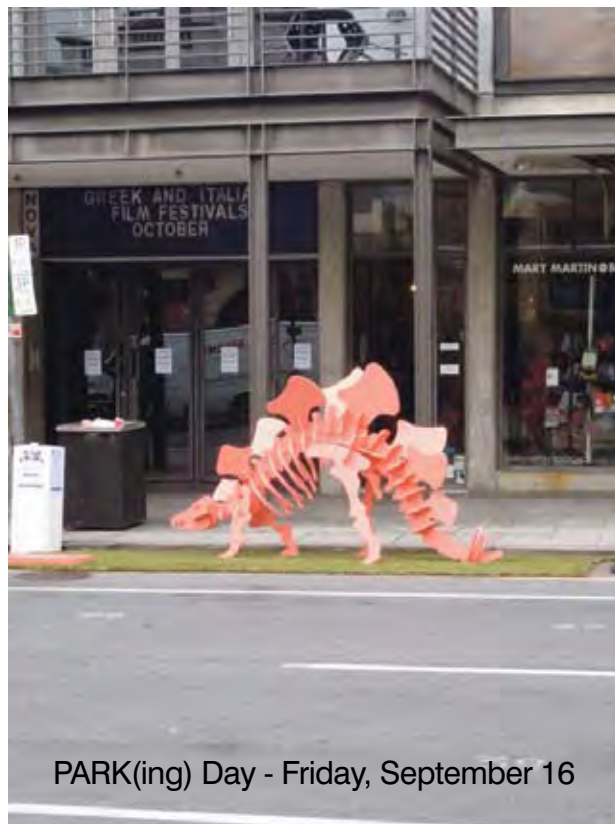

Kevin was a gracious and generous colleague who will be missed and mourned by many.

PARK(ing) Day - Friday, September 16



The art of parking

Landscape architect and local champion of the international Park(ing) Day initiative, **Ben Willsmore**, explains the importance of this special day in September.

PARK(ing) Day began in San Francisco in 2005 and last year spread to 700 PARKs in 140 cities across 21 countries and six continents. Adelaide managed 12 PARKs in our first attempt last year. The idea is based on the concept that paying a parking meter is like “renting” a public space, and instead of parking a car, why not park something else? PARKs are surprising, fun additions to the everyday street environment, and powerful symbols of communities wanting to improve urban quality.

Last year 12 PARKs sprung up across Adelaide CBD, from Rundle St, Pirie St, Gouger St and Halifax St, thanks to the efforts of design offices Woodhead, Enoki, HASSELL, Oxigen, Swanbury Penglase, Walter Brooke and Associates, JPE Design Studio, Hosking Design, Taylor Cullity Lethlean along with the SA Young Planners, Bicycle Institute of SA and theatre group Playback Willunga. The PARKs both entertained and confused the lunch-time crowds, and special mention must go to award recipients HASSELL (*The Adelaide Review* People’s Choice) and Enoki (Presidents Award).

International PARK(ing) Day is an “open-source” project created by Rebar who provided a “how to” manual that has inspired and empowered groups around the world to instigate their own event. With the assistance of the Adelaide City Council and *The Adelaide Review*, it is hoped this year will be bigger and better than last, including the after party. Adelaide PARK(ing) Day is being coordinated by a volunteer collective of designers (urban designers, planners, architects and landscape architects) and seeking support from the institutions and members of the Australian Institute of Landscape Architects (AILA), New Architects Group (NAG) of the Architects Institute of Australia (AIA), Young Designers Group of the Planning Institute of Australia (PIA) and the Design Institute of Australia (DIA). Five in race to zero

Five finalists have been chosen in the race to build a zero-carbon house at the Land Management Corporation's Lochiel Park at Campbelltown.

Entrants must design a three bedroom eco-friendly home for \$300,000 or less and the winning design will ultimately be built at the development to showcase energy-efficiency and environmental standards.

The Zero Carbon Challenge is a joint project between the Land Management Corporation (LMC) and the State Government's Integrated Design Commission (IDC). LMC chief executive Wayne Gibbings was happy with the response from the architecture, development and construction sectors.

"The number of submissions and the strength of the individual teams are outstanding," he said.

Government Architect Ben Hewett said he hoped the competition would help to push the limits on the latest techniques in sustainable and affordable building.

"This is an important initiative that recognises opportunities of collaboration across skills and disciplines," Hewett said.

The teams must comprise architects, licensed builders and a student to increase the cross-discipline collaboration opportunities and encourage skill acquisition in the area of sustainable housing.

The five finalist teams are:

Team VIM: Buzz Architecture; Scholz Vinall Design; Scott Salisbury Group / AREA Construction; JDR#1; and Connor Holmes; Exhibition studios; Dr Terry Williamson – Adelaide University; Jonathan Muecke; Vanessa Menadue; and Lyrian Daniel.

Collaborative Future: Cundall; TS4 Architecture; Holdfast Construction; Eco Active; Urban Sustainable Landscapes; MLEI; WT Partnership; Acdev; Ken Long; and Brock Urban Projects.

Energy Aspect Living: Energy Aspect Living; Bateup Urban Design; Alex Heath; RCI Consulting Engineers; and Bateup Visual Graphics.

Sekisui House Services SA: All required expertise from in-house.

Swanbury Penglase: Swanbury Penglase; Arup; Stephen Robert Berry; Rossdale Homes; and UniSA's Dr Frank Bruno.

In the next stage of the competition, the five teams will take their concepts through to detailed design, costing and calculation of embodied and operating energy.

Once a winner is selected, they will be required to work with a carbon verification consultant to assess their design in accordance with the Federal Government's national carbon offset standard to verify the carbon performance of the house over its projected life.

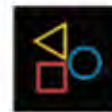
Change of the guard at DIA
