In April 2009 a group of 15 emerging leaders from across the Australian water sector travelled to Europe and Singapore to discover what it takes to create a water sensitive city.

The group is now ready to unveil their second report, titled **Ideas for a Water Sensitive City**. This report outlines over 80 ideas encountered on the tour. The group has prepared this report as a toolkit to assist peers and fellow professionals take steps towards achieving a water sensitive city. The ideas cover topics such as capacity building, community engagement, facilitating change, champions and leaders, technical solutions and future planning.

A key learning from the tour was the importance of collaboration across multiple disciplines in achieving a water sensitive city. This launch is for future leaders in engineering, social science, landscape architecture, education and environmental sectors.
